Hello, my Sisters and Brothers,

I have something that has been on my mind for a long time. This year has been a tremendous learning experience for me. I want to share this idea with you. I admit, I am nervous as to how this will be received. I don't wish to cause trouble, but I also can't sit back and ride out the rest of my term without trying to make everyone understand.

How many of us see all those commercials on television asking for money? You know the ones I mean some want \$19.00 a month to help save abused animals, some want your donation of \$20.00 a month to help children in hospitals, and some want your money to support some candidate running for whatever position.

Those are all worthwhile charities and being the kind of people we are, we rush to help, sending in our monthly donations without a second thought. It is the nature of most human beings to see the suffering, afflictions, and poverty affecting our fellow man, and with hearts full of compassion and care, most of us give what we can to help.

Well, I want to tell you that our own beloved Iowa Order of the Eastern Star is in trouble. There simply is not enough income to meet expenses. The general fund is what this business operates on, and every year, we have to rob Peter to pay Paul, and Peter is just about tapped out and will have to be repaid very soon. Yes, we have investments. Yes we have stocks. But every year we have to pull money out of those investments to meet our expenses. This will not last much longer.

Well, Cheryl, what if we raised our dues? Wouldn't that help? Of course, it would help, unfortunately that is legislation, and we don't have time for legislation this year. Maybe next year this can be discussed, and legislation is proposed; I really hope it becomes a reality.

But, Cheryl, we have money in several accounts! Thousands of dollars, why are we going broke? Because the ESTARL fund, the Educational fund, the Session Fund to name a few----all those are restricted funds. Can't' touch them. All those funds are dedicated funds. But, Cheryl, we give money to the homes, to ESTARL, to the Educational Board, that all goes to Grand Chapter. True, but all those donations that members give to those places, GOES to those places, and does not benefit Grand Chapter's General Fund in any way, at all. Grand Chapter is the funnel, so your money comes in and goes directly to the destination you dictate on the memo line of your check.

Nobody is suggesting that you should not give to those places. OF COURSE, it is perfectly all right, it is your choice. Just know that those donations do not benefit the General Fund at all. Take the homes for instance. Iowa Eastern Star does NOT own these facilities. They are their own entities; they have their own 501-C-3 status; they do NOT belong to Eastern Star. Your donations are welcomed with gratitude. But your donations to these places do not benefit the General Fund at all.

So, I want to ask you, what does the Order of the Eastern Star mean to you? Why do you belong? What is the reason that keeps you as a member? Is it the fellowship? Friendships? What we do as an Organization by helping raise money for the Worthy Grand Matron's Project? Is the Ritual work? Are you proud of our Proficiency? Every member belongs for a reason.

So, let me ask you this: **is the Order of the Eastern Star worth a dime to you?** Yes a dime...ten pennies... one tenth of a dollar...one little silver dime. Do you have you a dime in your pocket or purse or one floating around in the tray in the car or hiding in the sofa in your home? Have you a jar of the little pieces of silver at home?

What if every dues paying and lifetime member of Iowa Eastern Star donated one dime, every day, 365 days a year to Grand Chapter? Sound silly? Correct: it is not feasible, to send in one dime a day, but each member could save a dime each day. Right? How much of a hardship is saving one dime a day?
