

Vicki's leadership through a year of honoring our veterans, first responders, and front-line workers reminded us of the heroes we encounter every day and often take for granted. Watchwords of community and courage had us reaching out to our local communities offering our time and energy. Often celebrating with our heroes. Spreading the OES spirit in our communities was accomplished! We waved our flags and proudly wore our red, white and blue.

Vicki was born on April 20, 1957, to Robert R. Mallette and JoAnn De Tienne Mallette in Davenport, Iowa while her father was stationed in Germany. The first girl born on the Mallette side of the family in 64 years.

On January 3, 1976, she married Joel Francois and they became the parents of two sons, Jeremy Joseph and Ryan Michael. She married Thomas Wallner in 1997 and he

passed away in 2008. Vicki has three grandsons, three stepdaughters, ten step grandchildren and two step great grandchildren. Vicki graduated from high school in 1975 and became a member of Davenport Chapter on June 23<sup>rd</sup> of that same year. Adah was her first station and she served as WM in 1981. In 2008 I had the privilege of appointing her a District Instructor, where she continued to serve until 2012 when Sister Karen Hyde and Brother Dennis DeJoode appointed her their Grand Marshal. In 2013 she returned to instructing and was elected Associate Grand Conductress at the Heart of the Country Grand Chapter Session in 2018. She also served with Sister Beverly Smith during her service as Grand Treasurer. Due to the cancellation of Grand Chapter in 2021 because of the Covid epidemic it wasn't until at the session of the 2022 Grand Chapter that she was elected WGM and served beside Brother Larry Niday in 2023. They were honored to preside over the HERO session in October of 2023.

In her free time Vicki enjoys making T-shirts and cards and enjoys walking. Both activities were put to good use while leading the members to make more than 4,000 cards for the Cards for Troops project. The HERO project was the recipient of proceeds from her walk of 750 miles.

Her choice of a patriotic theme was based on her and Larry's military backgrounds. Larry and her father served in the Army. Husband Tom was in the Marine Corp. Son Ryan and nephew Richard are in the Air Force and nephew Brenden is in the Navy.

Her HERO Grand Chapter session closed out a fun, productive successful year and paid a loving tribute to all our heroes.

LARRY R. NIDAY Worthy Grand Patron 2022-2023

Larry Niday was born in Nyssa Oregon on April 19th, 1946, when his parents, Vernon and Ethel Niday moved there looking for work. While still a baby, they moved back to their hometown of Allerton Iowa, where Larry spent the rest of his childhood. Larry's father, Vernon worked on construction, which required them to move frequently around the Midwest. That gave Larry the experience of attending many types of schools in the surrounding states, from one school that was large enough to have two classes of third graders to a country school where he was the only student in the fifth grade. He says it was the only time he was valedictorian. Every winter, the family would return to Allerton where he could reconnect with his lifelong friends. He graduated from ACL Community Schools in 1964.

Larry attended Centerville Community College for two years, but it was obvious that College wasn't the path for him at the time, soon, he found that he was at the top of the

list for the draft. He spent two years in the Army as a Combat Engineer with the third Infantry Division in Germany.

During his tour of duty, he and Nancy were married and she was able to join him in Germany for ten months. There, they learned to live a very sparce life, Nancy cooked on a woodburning stove, the water heater had to be fired up 30 minutes before they could take a bath and the refrigerator was a beer cooler. That prepared them for anything that life might throw at them in the years ahead. At this writing, Larry and Nancy have been married for fifty-seven years and have two sons and six grandchildren.

After returning home from the military, Larry worked several jobs, from parts manager at a Ford dealership, then manager for a parts store, to construction, before he started a career at the 3M Tape Plant in Knoxville, where he worked for thirty-one years.

Larry had always regretted not finishing college and had a deep passion for art, so he started taking classes and soon became a full-time student while working the night shift at 3M. After ten years, he graduated with a bachelor's degree, in art from Simpson College, a master's degree and finally a Master of Fine Art from the University of Iowa. He took early retirement from 3M in 2007 to teach art at the Des Moines Art Center and teach classes in his studio at home.

Larry was not familiar with the Masonic Order before he joined Nancy's family. The first thing he learned was that they had a strong Masonic history and encouraged him to join, which he did in 1969. He joined the Corydon lodge and he and Nancy joined the Corydon Chapter of Eastern Star in 1970. Nancy's parents, Walter and Helen Teater, initiated them and Walter learned the long optional just for their initiation and never gave it again after that.

In 1992, Nancy became a District Instructor, they traveled the state while Nancy fulfilled her duties as Instructor, Grand Chaplain and in 2004, became Grand Secretary. Larry claims to be the most experienced Traveling Companion in the Order. Their extensive travels gave them the opportunity to get acquainted with nearly every member in the State of Iowa and they have made many lifelong friends that they have cherished for many years.

In 2019, Vicki Wallner surprised Larry with an invitation to join her as her Worthy Grand Patron. Although Larry had always said that was a job he would never want, he had known Vicki for many years and they had been long time friends. It didn't take much thought to make that decision. It has been a highlight of his life and he has never regretted a minute of it.

Kathryn and I met the Essing's at the Iowa Grand Chapter level when Danelle was assigned as Kathryn's Big Sister among District Instructors. That relationship deepened when Sister Danelle chose Kathryn to be her Grand Esther in the Highlander Grand Family of 2003. An amusing fund raiser during that time was the "Save or Shave" campaign concerning Brother Randy's beard. Some used their pocket change and even folding money to see clean-shaven cheeks. Others contributed more to preserve his whiskers. It was a lot of fun for all, except perhaps for Worthy Grand Matron Danelle's traveling companion.

Brother Randy was chosen to travel with Sister JoAnn Bergeson. Their "God's Garden of Life" year was filled with quilts, butterflies, baseball gloves, birdhouses, garden fairies and even Snoopy. Funds were raised for the University of Iowa to research coronary heart disease, in honor of departed brother Bernie Bergeson. The Travel Club could "round the bases" by attending events throughout the year. One such event was the official visit to Waverly Chapter to confer the degrees. The candidates were none other than our daughters Erin and Nina. The Waverly-Shell Rock High School gymnasium was converted into a quilt-lined garden. What a gentle and soft-spoken Worthy Grand Patron to introduce our precious girls into our beautiful Order. He truly embodied his chosen scripture, becoming a fruitful branch of the vine which is our LORD and Savior.

The following year Sister Diane Bargfrede and Brother Russ Altes tapped me to be their Stars and Stripes Grand Chaplain. Randy sponsored me to join the York Rite College, further cementing our bond as friends and Masonic brothers. From that time forward, our written correspondences began with "Greetings Sir Knight" and the salutation of "Another Sir Knight." Sometime during that era we began our custom of baseball book exchanges, exercising our mutual passions for baseball and books. For those that may not know, Randy's profession was a librarian at the University of Iowa's Libraries. Randy was especially appreciative of these baseball books in the mail during his latter years while hospitalized or homebound.

One of my most precious memories of Randy occurred during a Highlander summer reunion held in Ames. At Reimann Gardens, Randy and I spent several hours conversing and reminiscing in that beautiful venue. With lunch at Hickory Park and visits to the Campanile, Mauker Union and the University Book Store, the relaxing dialogue in the Gardens remains the highlight of that special day.

The broken column is an emblem which represents an earthly life cut off all too soon, but an unshakeable faith in an eternal life.

Electa: The lesson of Electa is love and hospitality. Electa consistently acted with love toward her fellow man. The cup is an emblem of that charity and hospitality, which Electa demonstrated in her love-inspired gifts to the poor and distressed, along with her testimony of her love of Christ.

Bible: God's love for His people, and instructions for our lives, is at the center of all of these lessons. The Bible is placed on the Altar to symbolize the Spirit of God in the human heart.

#### United States Flag:

The American Flag is not just a piece of fabric. It is symbolic of the fabric of our society as a nation. It has been carried far and wide as a symbol of American pride, all the while serving as an emblem of the freedom we hold dear.

#### Canadian Flag:

The flag of Canada is unofficially called Maple Leaf. Consisting of red fields on the left and right sides and a white square on the center, the Canadian flag is embellished by an 11-pointed maple leaf. The history of the flag is not very old, the flag was adopted in February 1965. Prior to it, the Union Jack represented the whole country.

#### Christian Flag:

We can interpret the colors and symbols of the Christian flag as follows: the field is white, representing peace, purity, and holiness. The blue canton is emblematic of loyalty and truth (and possibly of heaven or the waters of baptism). The cross in the center of the blue canton is, of course, a symbol of Christ and His work of salvation; the cross is red, typical of Christ's shed blood. Taken together, the symbols of the Christian flag portray the basics of the faith: Jesus Christ, the Holy One, died on the cross to grant us salvation, and we serve Him in fidelity and holiness, as He is faithful to us.

#### Eastern Star Flag:

The Eastern Star Flag: The Eastern Star Flag is a beautiful symbol of our Order and as such merits our love and respect. Its unique design and bright colors allude to the lessons taught by the heroines of our Order and remind us that we should always endeavor to exemplify the sublime virtues of Fidelity, Constancy, Loyalty, Faith, and Love. Not only in our Chapter Rooms, but, in our everyday lives.

#### Masonic Flag:

We pay tribute to the Masonic flag in order to honor our Master Masons, as they are the foundation of our Order. The flag bears the Square and Compasses an emblem that reminds every Mason of his gratitude to the Supreme Architect of the Universe, and his commitment to the teachings of Freemasonry, and serves as a symbol of Brotherly Love, Relief and Truth.

#### South Carolina Flag:

South Carolina's flag has a rich history that dates back to the Revolutionary War. The flag features a blue field with a white palmetto tree and a white crescent in the upper-left corner. The origins of the flag design can be traced back to 1775 when Colonel William Moultrie designed a flag to fly over Fort Moultrie during the British attack on Sullivan's Island. The flag's design was inspired by the palmetto's ability to withstand the force of cannonballs, which played a pivotal role in the fort's successful defense. The palmetto tree is also the state tree, which is a symbol of victory and resilience. The crescent symbolizes the state's commitment to defending its freedom and independence.

#### Ohio Flag:

The Ohio flag was designed by John Eisemann and officially adopted in 1902. The blue triangular field represents Ohio's hills and valleys. It contains seventeen white stars thirteen stars surrounding the circle are symbols of the original thirteen colonies. Four stars at the apex of the triangle raise the total number of stars to seventeen (Ohio was the 17th state to enter the Union in 1803). The red and white stripes represent the roads and waterways of the state. The white circle with a red center forms an "O" for "Ohio" and is also related to Ohio's nickname

#### Iowa State Flag:

lowa was almost 75 years old before the state banner was adopted by the Legislature in 1921. With memory of the Civil War still fresh in their minds, lowans had not adopted a state banner because they felt a national banner was the only one needed. lowa's flag was designed by the state's Daughters of the American Revolution in response to lowa National Guardsmen stationed at the Mexican border during WWI that requested an emblem of lowa to represent their unit.

The flag consists of three vertical stripes: the blue stripe stands for loyalty, justice and truth; the white stripe for purity; and the red stripe for courage. On the white center an eagle carries streamers in its beak which are inscribed with the state's motto: "Our liberties we prize and our rights we will maintain." The name "IOWA" is in red below the streamers.

#### Rainbow Flag:

The seven colors of the Rainbow are used to represent seven teachings that each member receives on her journey toward the pot of gold. William Mark Sexson, a Christian minister and active member of the Masonic Lodge, founded the International Order of the Rainbow for Girls in 1922.

#### Job's Daughter's Flag:

The Job's Daughters Flag is composed of the emblematic colors of the Order. The four purple stripes represent the highest ideals of life and the royalty of womanhood. The three white strips symbolize the purity of a beautiful and womanly life. The emblem is the three Daughters enclosed within a triangle representing the threefold influences of Job's Daughters, God, Country, and Home. Job's Daughters was started in 1922 by Mrs. Ethel Wead Mick, who was born and raised in Atlantic, Iowa.

#### DeMolay Flag:

The white field of the DeMolay flag symbolizes purity and the cleanness of thought, word and deed. The three red stripes represent the basic tenants and foundation of DeMolay, those being Love of God, Love of home, and Love of Country. The helmet is emblematic of chivalry, the crescent is a sign of secrecy, the five-armed white cross symbolizes one's intentions to always remember the motto of the Order. The crossed swords denote justice, fortitude and mercy. The official emblem is centered around a crown which is symbolic of the Crown of Youth and constantly reminds a DeMolay of his obligations and the seven Precepts of his Order.

As all the flags have been placed in honor, let them remind us to honor everything that they stand for.

Of course, I am so happy that Iowa has made tributes to honor the appointments that Lon and I have made you and I can tell by from the wonderful things you have said about your General Grand Chapter Committee Members and your special Diane, I didn't know she was one of those dancing girls until I

heard that. They know more about you than I do Sister Diane. You can get in pretty good but getting out is something else, you have to push this little lever at the bottom of the door just right and then you have to push the button over here and everything will open and that is ok. But then two things you have to get by first, you have to get by the Cadillac that's in the driveway that belongs to the Right Worthy Grand Secretary and he would not be very happy if I scratched that red Cadillac. So, I was very careful not to do that. Now as Most Worthy Grand Matron, I don't have a valet to help me at all. #### **PROJECTS**

We were excited to have a major project and three additional projects we raised funds for during 2023. Project Healing Waters (a project originally organized by Brother Larry), Blue Star Moms (headed in Iowa by Sandy Raab) and a Community Service Program by students whose teacher is Sister Kathy Panzar, were the three projects we were excited to be able to donate \$2,000 each for their causes. Project Healing Waters works with our veterans in learning to tie flies and be out in nature to fly fish. Blue Star Moms send care packages to our Iowa deployed service members and the Community Service Project also sends care packages to deployed service members. Each group was given their checks at our last official visit at Knoxville Chapter and Eddyville Chapter.

Healing at English River Outfitters was our major project. We met with this group in Washington, lowa at their newly constructed Lodge, which at the time was still under construction. We were impressed with the dedication to the project and assisting our veterans with many of their issues. We were able to have our Grand Family visit the Lodge on the day of their ribbon cutting, for their first annual Easter Egg Hunt and then we rented the Lodge for a weekend of travel in the area. We realized just how peaceful and calming this area would be for our veterans. HERO enables veterans from both lowa and other states to hunt, never realized how many hunters want to come to lowa for deer season!

Throughout the year we sold our HERO pins, stars for our pot of gold, coin marches, donations, and the Hero Banquet. We raised an astonishing \$53,460.90 for the project, with \$47,460.90 going directly to HERO for their use in keeping the project alive and well. We also saw a need when we stayed at the Lodge, they needed more kitchen and bath towels. Many of the Grand Officers provided towels and Sister Kris Stolba embroidered their logo on the towels. They should be set with towels for a while.

Through meeting the Board at HERO, we have established lifelong friendships, and they know we are there for them in the future.

#### TLC PROJECTS

Sister Sandy Raab was chairman of the TLC Sewing projects. During the year she and her sewing crew crafted 413 Christmas stockings and 500 packable neck pillows to be included in the care packages the Blue Star Moms were sending to our deployed service members.

## REPORT OF THE GRAND SECRETARY

It seems like only yesterday that I began this journey and now I am completing my fifth year as your Grand Secretary, and I have enjoyed every minute of it. My days are filled with greeting our sisters and brothers though emails, phone calls and sometimes office visits.

The year began with the receptions for the Bucket Brigade Grand Family. Tim and I were able to attend all except one reception this year. To the BB's it has been a pleasure getting to know each one of you. You are to be commended for the fine way you represented your own chapters as well as Grand Chapter.

I was privileged to serve as Secretary for State School again this year. I commend the members of the Board of Custodians as they continue to make changes to the format in the best interest of Grand Chapter. The District Instructors did an excellent job and I am sure their chapters benefited greatly from their instruction and the caring way it is presented.

The decline of chapters continues. We had one chapter consolidate since our last session. Two more consolidations will be complete by the year's end. I wish I had the solution on how to stop this, but unfortunately, I don't. The membership can rest assured that the decisions made by these dedicated individuals are done so in the spirit of what is best for our Order now and into the future.

Thirteen months later, members are still making contributions to the "Give A Dime" Project. To date this dime a day has blessed Grand Chapter with \$16,583.63. Thank you, Sister Cheryl, and to our Worthy Grand Matron Vicki for continuing to support this project in 2023.

She kiddingly calls me a slave driver (you are kidding right?) but the tasks she takes on, eases my workload allowing me time to get to get the daily work done and other responsibilities, that come with this position.

#### REPORT OF THE GRAND TREASURER

Worthy Grand Matron, Worthy Grand Patron, I want to thank you for all you have done this past year. I know there have been many challenges and changes in your year and you both have stepped up and taken them on and the Grand Chapter of lowa is in a better place because of your efforts, it is my pleasure to present this my final report as your Grand Treasurer.

Members and Guests, thank you all for being here today to hear about the Great things that have gone on during the year of 2023 and how we are changing to meet the challenges of the years to come. As I have told you in the past your Grand Chapter is financially challenged, we are not meeting even our monthly expenses under the current dues structure and if you do not approve the recommendation to increase dues we will continue to be financially challenged and your board of trustees will be looking at some tough decisions for the operation of the Grand Chapter.

I will tell you we have some very special folks with us that have made sure we continue to operate by sharing with us their dollars which are far above their dues, please trust I know who you are and appreciate your dedication and sharing - I will not point these folks out individually because they are not doing it for the recognition they are doing it because they want to see our Grand Chapter be here in the future, Thank You! Many, yes, many of you have given to the I give a dime project that was started with just one little idea instituted by Past Worthy Grand Matron Cheryl Payne. It appears we will run about \$20,000.00 under our projected loss which was approved in last year's budget at our general session because of those donations. Which means We should be about \$14,000.00 in the red for the year depending on how our investments continue to perform, if they stay on track we may not even go that far in the red. This would not have been possible without the special contributions by our members and the fund-raising efforts by Worthy Grand Matrons and Patrons for our Grand Chapter. We told you of our challenges and you all stepped up! Will these continue in the future? Who knows? Our membership continues to go down in numbers and our chapters continue to consolidate and disappear. It was not an easy decision for your board of trustees to make the recommendation to increase dues but they have squeezed the bottom line as far as they can and therefore, please give due consideration to increasing the dues rate as recommended

This was our first calendar year for financial operations as opposed to a fiscal year. I think the work is almost done and next year your trustees will be able to work with complete comparative financials that will give them the trends and projections they need to make the tough decisions.

We have included a year end income Statement and Balance Sheet in your packet. This was requested by the board so we can share with you where we are and where we will head as we move forward. If you have any questions, please feel free to ask your trustees, Nancy Ramthun or myself and we will try to get those questions answered for you.

At the May Trustees meeting there was a true concern raised considering the Grand Treasurers' open position and some members hesitating to run because of the accounting requirements I have talked about in the past. The Board of Trustees will be naming one among them to work with The Grand Secretary and Grand Treasurer to assure our financials are in order and will assist the board of trustees in the financial performance analysis of the Grand Chapter.

This addressed some of my concerns, making sure we have someone with accounting knowledge to assist in making sure there is a line of continuity going forward in our accounting procedures. The Grand Treasurer will continue to maintain the student loan portfolio, working with the Education Committee and our Grand Secretary. They just added another set of hands to make sure the job gets done properly. Once this is fully implemented the Grand Secretary, Trustees Financial person, and the Grand Treasurer will work as a team to take care of the stuff I have worked on during my term as Grand Treasurer. Nancy cannot do it alone, there are just too many areas of the operation she is responsible for and accounting is just a minor part. She needs someone to be her right-hand person or second set of eyes to make sure our books are in order.

As I announced last year, this was last year as your Grand Treasurer. The time commitment, the traveling and the challenges with my health have taken their toll. I cannot continue as your Grand Treasurer for all these reasons and several more. I have enjoyed my time in the position and working with Nancy to make many changes. The work has been challenging at times, but I can say for the most part, it has been very rewarding and memorable.

Nancy Ramthun, needless to say, I have not made your life easy over the past few years. Truth be known I gave you a dart board with my picture on it the first year I was Grand Treasurer, I am having to leave because there is no picture left evidently all the darts hit the mark. As I watched these anniversary families be presented it was sad to see that many of the families had lost members. So, in 2008 I celebrated the crystal family and I'm pleased to say the tradition has continued. At the time 15 years seemed a long way off and yet here it has arrived. There have been many changes in our Grand Family and in Iowa OES. At Grand Chapter 2008 we had 126 chapters and 12,400 members. Currently, we have 68 chapters, little more than half and less than 4,000 members.

Our family is called the Kaleidoscopes. It is a family of many different talents, looks, dreams and abilities. Thank you, Sister Chris Brown, for the special tribute. You brought back many memories.

Even with historic lowa floods that year and very high gas prices that peaked at \$4.11 a gallon the Kaleidoscopes keep going. Our special project was S.M.A.R.T., which stands for Support Movement Arthritis Research Targeted working with the University of Iowa. The funds that year were used to obtain a million dollar grant to continue the work on osteoarthritis research. Our youth project, Change for Charity raised 610 pounds of quarters, nickels, dimes, and pennies. This was also the year the Pave a Memory brick project was started by Worthy Grand Patron John Baker. He insisted it would be a success and I was very skeptical. Well, he won that debate. We attended services for three Past Grand Matrons and one Past Grand Patron lost to death that year. These were the people we followed and who showed us the way.

One of the highlights of the year was the Good Works Reception held at the University of Iowa. Including the 2008 contribution Iowa Eastern Star had given over \$700,000 to the University at that time. A quote taken from the Good Works Reception committee report; "On that afternoon in April, we learned that our many bake sales, dinners, coin collections, and other fundraising efforts have not been in vain. Our beautiful Order is having a positive impact in improving the lives of thousands of people." And I would add we continue to do so. So, congratulations to all of you for making that happen.

Our family has lost four Grand Officers and six Grand Companions to death. We remember fondly. John Baker, Worthy Grand Patron; Joanne Scroggie, Associate Grand Conductress; Darlene Larsen, Grand Electa; and Ron Paulsen, Grand Sentinel. COMPANIONS, Margaret Batschelet, Dorothy Hinders, Earlene Walton, Bill Owen, Francis Prueitt, and Verna Paulsen.

To the Diamonds (our District Instructors), you shined bright all year long! We are so proud of you. You were the "Skippers" of your schools and you tickled us Pink, Ladies! I didn't even have to call out any of my Flying Monkeys to rein you in. We want to say that the District Instructors are some of the hardest working ladies we know. They are so devoted to their Star work. In Iowa, they must memorize the ritual – from balloting, opening, closing and initiation (including the long optional). Memorize the uniform wording sheet. Memorize the Secret Work. In Iowa we do not allow open rituals in our chapter meetings. So, if a District Instructor attends a meeting, she may be called upon at any time to be a prompter if needed. We have tons of respect for these ladies.

## REPORT OF THE BOARD OF GRAND TRUSTEES

President and Past Grand Marshal

The 2022-2023 Grand Chapter year continued our history of financial challenges for Iowa OES and for the Board of Grand Trustees (aka: The Board) to resolve. The Board was faced with the final resolution of financial and legal liability regarding the two retirement/care facilities that have long been associated with Grand Chapter. Other matters before The Board were: How can The Board reach the goal of approving a balanced budget? How is Grand Chapter going to maintain the current level of service of the Grand Secretary's office with less income from declining membership numbers? Is there a better way of reporting the financial status of Grand Chapter to the membership? Can The Board and Grand Chapter better utilize the Grand Treasurer position regarding fiscal accountability? How are Grand Chapter's financial woes going to impact the quality of our Ritual regarding our District Instructors and the Board of Custodians?

The Board's members are Bill Post, President; Jerry Jones, Vice-President, PGP; Jane Green, PGM; Jeanne Davis; Kenny Wogoman, PGP; and Worthy Grand Matron Vicki Wallner & Worthy Grand Patron Larry Niday. The line officers are included in the meetings, and they are: Mary Reicks, Assoc. Grand Matron, DI; Joe Reed, Assoc. Grand Patron; Sandy Meredith, Grand Conductress, DI; and Janice Alger, Assoc. Grand Conductress, DI; along with Nancy Ramthun, Grand Secretary, PGM and Kent Strawn, Grand Treasurer. The Board met after the October 2022 election for an organizational meeting welcoming Jane Green, PGM (filling the three-year term left vacant) and Kenny Wogoman, PGP (elected to a five-year term) to The Board and Janice Alger, AGC, DI. The Board met on February 12, 2023, at the Sleep Inn Hotel in Altoona following State

School. The Board met via Zoom on April 27, 2023. The Board met at the Grand Chapter office in Knoxville on May 21<sup>st</sup>, July 8<sup>th</sup>, and September 9<sup>th</sup>.

The Board decided to take a final step concerning the Eastern Star Masonic Home in Boone and the Barthell OES Home in Decorah. During the 2021-2022 Grand Chapter year, legal counsel had determined that Grand Chapter had no ownership or financial interest/liability in either of the Homes. At our February meeting, The Board tasked its member, Jane Green, PGM, to examine the Iowa Code Book and draft legislation to eliminate both Homes from our Iowa Code. The Board determined the only real impact for the Homes is that the Homes would have to elect their own Board members. The relationship between Grand Chapter and the Homes does not have to change, as the relationship rests on the Worthy Grand Matron and the Worthy Grand Patron. This legislation was reviewed and approved by The Board and was submitted to Grand Chapter's Jurisprudence Committee for their review.

The Board has been in the difficult situation of approving an unbalanced budget for several years. With declining membership, the per capita dues income has not met the expenses of Iowa Grand Chapter. The Board has been pulling from the principal of our investments for the past several years to meet budget demands. This trend has prompted legislation to increase the per capita tax for each dues-paying member in 2024 to \$34.00 from the current \$14.00 plus General Grand Chapter per capita dues (\$2.00) for all members. The 2024 budget will have a \$44,861.00 deficit to be made up from investment principal. Grand Chapter will not come close to reaching a balanced budget for 2025 unless the per capita tax increase is approved. (Per capita dues collected in 2024 are not payable/due to the Grand Secretary office until early 2025.) If the legislation is approved, the amount needed to pull from the principal of investments decreases significantly for the 2025 fiscal year. The Board has been made aware by our investment managers that lowa Grand Chapter will not be financially solvent in 10 years at the current level of withdrawal from our investment principal. The Board predicts that the current level of service provided by our Grand Chapter Office in Knoxville will be significantly reduced without this increase in our income.

The Grand Treasurer, Kent Strawn, has done an exemplary job improving Grand Chapter's financial tracking and reporting. He worked with our Grand Secretary, Nancy Ramthun, and The Board to change our fiscal year from October through October to a <u>calendar year</u>. The financials for 2023 will be the first full calendar year. Kent and Nancy restructured our operational financials, and we now have a clearer picture of where Grand Chapter stands financially. This is still a work in progress and more improvements are expected to be generated by Kent, Board member Jeanne Davis, and Nancy.

Legislation has been introduced to modify the payment structure of the District Instructors. If approved, it will create a stipend of \$300.00 to each district Instructor rather than paying mileage. This structure will assist The Board in planning the budget for future years. The Board appreciates the District Instructor's service to our Grand Chapter. The Ritual cannot be compromised and funding for our DI's cannot be cut any farther.

On a positive note, our investments have done well with our move to Carson Wealth Management in 2021. The communication pathway with Carson Wealth has been excellent, as they are based out of Cedar Rapids. They have done a superior job of managing our portfolio.

This past summer, The Board performed a detailed review of our insurance coverage and made the appropriate adjustments to the coverages.

The financial struggles of Grand Chapter are real, and The Board must deal with <u>keeping</u> <u>member services available</u>. Without financial support of dues income, The Board will have

the challenge of determining where future cuts in our budget will come from. If the Grand Chapter per capita tax increase passes, it will still present a small deficit to be taken from investments. Sister Nancy Ramthun was not presented with a wage increase. Sister Nancy Niday will be stepping away from being the part-time assistant in the office, thus the Grand Secretary will be handling the full load of the Grand Chapter office duties. The Board thanks Nancy Niday for her years of dedicated service and we appreciate Nancy Ramthun's dedication to our Grand Chapter and thanks her for her continued service.

The Board thanks the Finance Review Committee of Cyndi Grosing, Terri Grover, and Susan Whitson for their hard work and final report of the 2022 financial review of Grand Chapter.

The honest solution to our financial woes is to increase membership. It is up to each Chapter to recruit new quality members and restore the membership of suspended and demitted members.

## REPORT OF THE JURISPRUDENCE COMMITTEE

Linda Overturf, Chairman Worthy Matron Holly Chapter Malcom Past Grand Esther

Worthy Grand Matron, Sisters, and Brothers: It has been a pleasure for me to serve on the Jurisprudence Committee these past three years. I want to thank Sister Polly Miller for my original appointment. It has been an honor for me and for my chapters: Holly Chapter, Malcom and Toledo Chapter, Tama. It has been a privilege to serve Grand Chapter in this capacity. As Chairman of the Jurisprudence Committee, it is my pleasure to introduce those who have served with me this year Brother Grant Bargfrede and Sister Ronda Sturms.

We have received twelve proposals for changes to the code. They were received in proper form in the Grand Secretary's office before the June 26th deadline. We thank you for allowing us to serve on this committee this past year.

Before we begin with the Legislation, I would like to invite Brother Bill Post to speak about our two homes.

BILL POST, President, Board of Grand Trustees regarding the Eastern Star Masonic Home and the Barthell OES Home.

Worthy Grand Matron, Worthy Grand Patron, in 2021, we were having some issues with the Boone Home, primarily with the administrator. There were some financial requests that we denied by the Home. So, we got into a question of "Do we own the home?." This was always a little bit of a gray area and we had many discussions about it in our Trustees Meetings in 2021 and 2022. So, ultimately, this document that is in the packets is a memo from the Boone Home's lawyer, Patrick White to Rick Colby and it reads:

"You asked me to consider whether the Grand Chapter of the Order of the Eastern Star, here called the Grand Chapter, is liable for obligations of the Eastern Star Masonic Home, which he calls the Eastern Star. I have reviewed the Eastern Star Home's Articles of Incorporation beginning with the amended and substitute Articles of September 27<sup>th</sup>, 1954, and has been amended various times through 2004. I've also reviewed Eastern Star Home's June 26<sup>th</sup>, 2013, bylaws, which I understand to be the most current version. I have not reviewed the corporate documents of the Grand Chapter. The Eastern Star Home and The Grand Chapter are organized under the Iowa Code Chapter 504, the revised Iowa non-profit corporation. As non-profit corporations they do not shareholders, as a for-profit would.

Additionally, as such, they cannot have ownership interests in one another. Because of this, Grand Chapter does not have ownership or authority for the obligations for the Eastern Star Home, nor have I seen any other basis of liability by the virtue of Grand Chapter's and the Eastern Star Home's corporate relationship to one another.

The Grand Chapter could possibly be liable for Eastern Star Home's obligations:

Number one, if the Grand Chapter has contractually agreed to be liable for obligations, for example, co-signing a debt. I have not reviewed all of the Eastern Star Home's contracts; however Eastern Star Home has not made me aware of any obligations for which the Grand Chapter has contractually agreed to be liable.

Number 2, If the Grand Chapter owns property that Eastern Star Home uses, for example, if someone on that property was injured. Eastern Star Home has not made me aware of any property that Grand Chapter owns.

Number 3, If the Grand Chapter exercised control over the day-to-day operations of the Eastern Star Home, my understanding is that the Eastern Star Home governs its own day-to-day affairs, that The Grand Chapter does not control the Eastern Star Home's day-to-day business. I am also not aware of any other basis for which the Grand Chapter being liable for the Eastern Star Home's obligations.

You also asked me to consider what would happen to Eastern Star Home's assets if it dissolved. As amended on November 1st, 1986, Eastern Star Home's Article of Incorporations state that if Eastern Star Home dissolves and there are any assets remaining after satisfaction of all debts and obligations, the remaining assets shall be paid over and transferred to such a charitable corporation that has an office in the State of Iowa and determined by a two thirds vote of the eligible voting delegates in the annual meeting or a special called meeting of the Grand Chapter of Iowa, Order of the Eastern Star at the time if dissolution and which charitable corporation shall qualify as an organization exempt from taxation under section 501(c)3 by the Internal Revenue code of 1954 or a corresponding division of any future United States Internal Revenue law. In other words, an Eastern Star Home is resolved and any profit from any debts and obligations are met then it has to be given to a 501(c)3 charitable corporation."

That is the legal memo we received regarding the lack of ownership Grand Chapter has over the Home. I did speak with the Barthell Home Board, we have no ownership of the Barthell Home either and no liabilities concerning that other than we continue to elect the Board. They understand everything that is proposed and are willing to move forward with that change.

#### 2023 LEGISLATION

#### Section 214. EASTERN STAR MASONIC HOME BOARD - BOONE

Eliminate pages 86 - 96 of the Code relating to the Eastern Star Masonic Home Board at Boone, which reads:

The Eastern Star Masonic Home is established and maintained by the Grand Chapter to furnish a home for elderly people, giving preference to members of the Order of the Eastern Star. Said Home is under the direction and control of a Board of Trustees consisting of seven members of the Grand Chapter. Five members of the Grand Chapter shall be elected by ballot of Grand Chapter for a term of five years, the term of one to expire each year. A member who has served two consecutive full terms shall not be eligible for re-election until the lapse of one Grand Chapter year. The two remaining members of the Board shall be the Worthy Grand Matron and the Worthy Grand Patron during their respective terms of office. Said Board shall elect annually from their own members a President, Vice-President, Secretary and Treasurer. The Secretary-Treasurer of said Board shall give corporate surety bond in accordance with the provision of Grand Chapter, Section 61 of the Code.

Section 215. HOW SUPPORTED -

There shall be appropriated annual an amount to aid in the support and maintenance of said Home.

There is also established a special fund known as the Endowment Fund of the Eastern Star Masonic Home, which is a trust fund for the support and maintenance of the Home. Said Fund shall remain intact, but the income therefrom shall be credited quarterly to the General Fund of the Home. Donations and bequests for the benefit of the Home shall also be used for the purpose expressed by the donors. All amounts received by the Board shall be accounted for, and the Board shall make an annual report to the Grand Chapter. Said Board shall prepare a budget each year and submit it to Grand Chapter for the proposed expenditures of the ensuing year. The annual report shall show in detail receipts and expenditures and also a statement of residents admitted and discharged, cost of maintenance, and other items of interest which may be required by the Worthy Grand Matron, Worthy Grand Patron, or the Grand Chapter.

Section 216. APPLICATION, HOW MADE -

The initial request or application and also the formal and final application shall be made through the office of the Administrator of the Home. Verification of membership in the Order of the Eastern Star shall be determined by affidavit obtained from the Chapter of membership stated by the applicant.

CERTIFICATE OF ADOPTION OF RENEWAL. AMENDED AND SUBSTITUTED ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION OF THE EASTERN STAR MASONIC HOME RESOLUTION

WHEREAS the original Articles of Incorporation of the Eastern Star Masonic Home will expire by operation of the laws of the State of Iowa on October 28, 1954.

AND WHEREAS the Grand Chapter of the Order of the Eastern Star of Iowa did at its regular annual session held at Des Moines, Iowa, on the 27<sup>th</sup> day of October, 1954, adopt Renewal Amended and Substituted Articles of Incorporation in the form as set out fully below, and directed the President and Secretary of the Eastern Star Masonic Home to adopt, execute, acknowledge, and file with the Secretary of State, Renewal, Amended and Substituted Articles of Incorporation in the name of EASTERN STAR MASONIC HOME.

and to do all things necessary to renew and extend the life of the original articles and the corporation heretofore known as the Eastern Star Masonic Home.

NOW BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Trustees of the Eastern Star Masonic Home in regular session, that the following Articles be adopted as a renewal of the Articles of Incorporation of the Eastern Star Masonic Home.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the President and Secretary of the Board of Trustees of the Eastern Star Masonic Home be and they are hereby authorized and directed to execute and acknowledge this certificate and these and the attached RENEWAL, AMENDED AND SUBSTITUTED ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION in the name of the Corporation and do all things required by law to make the same effective.

RENEWAL, AMENDED AND SUBSTITUTED ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION OF THE EASTERN STAR MASONIIC HOME

We, the undersigned, do by these precepts associate ourselves together as a corporation not for pecuniary profit by virtue of Chapter 504 of the Code of Iowa, and the laws amendatory thereto, and do renew and adopt the following Articles of Incorporation.

ARTICLE I. The name of this corporation shall be the EASTERN STAR MASONIC HOME. It shall commence business as soon as these Articles are filed in the office of the Secretary of the State of Iowa, and continue for a period of fifty years, with the right of renewal, and its principal place of business shall be in or near the city of Boone, in Boone County, Iowa.

ARTICLE II. The object and purpose of this Corporation shall be to hold title to and operate the Eastern Star Masonic Home at Boone, Iowa, which is a charitable home for members of the Order of the Eastern Star of Iowa, and for this purpose it may raise, control and disburse funds, may take by gift, purchase, devise, or bequest, real and personal property for the purpose appropriate to its creation. Property coming into its possession intended for the Endowment Fund of the Easter Star Masonic Home shall be transferred to the said Endowment fund within 120 days after it is received.

ARTICLE III. The affairs of this corporation shall be managed by a Board of Trustees of seven members, consisting of the Worthy Grand Matron and Worthy Grand Patron, ex officio, and five members who shall be elected by Grand Chapter of the Order of Eastern Star of Iowa, at such times and in such manner as said Grand Chapter may determine. The officers shall be a President, Vice President, and Secretary/Treasurer, to be elected from the members of the Board of Trustees annually at its meeting coinciding with the annual meeting of the Grand Chapter of the Order of the Eastern Star of Iowa, and their duties shall be such as are usual in such cases, or as may be prescribed by the Bylaws of this corporation or the rules adopted in conformity therewith, as well as by regulations adopted by the Grand Chapter. Said Board of Trustees shall have the power to fill any vacancy occurring in said board or said officers, by appointment, until the next general election, or until his or her successor is elected and qualified.

The following named persons shall constitute the first Board of Trustees: Mrs. Jessie Wheeler, Mrs. Bessie McMurray, Clinton Kastner, Mrs. Philomena Fox, and Clifford H. Young, and the Worthy Grand Matron and Worthy Grand Patron, who shall as soon as convenient proceed to elect the officers above provided and they shall hold office until their successors are elected and qualified. Said Board of Trustees shall have power to fill any vacancy occurring in said Board or said officers, by appointment, until the next general election, or until his or her successor is elected and qualified.

ARTICLE IV. The time and place of the annual meeting of the corporation shall be coincident with the time and place of the annual session of the Grand Chapter of the Order of the Eastern Star of Iowa.

ARTICLE V. Any of the five elected members of the Board of Trustees of the Eastern Star Masonic Home may be recalled and the office declared vacant, providing a recall petition signed by fifty members of the Grand Chapter shall be presented to the Grand Chapter before three o-clock PM of the second day of the Grand Chapter Session and shall be carried by a majority of the members voting. In the event the recall is perfected and the office becomes vacant, then a ballot shall be taken on the third day of such session to fill the vacancy.

ARTICLE VI. This corporation shall have a corporate seal and all contracts for the conveyance of real estate shall be signed by the Corporation by its President and attested by the Secretary with the corporate seal attached.

ARTICLE VII. The bylaws of this Corporation shall be adopted by the Board of Trustees and may be amended at any time by two-thirds of said Trustees voting affirmatively for such change, provided that no amendments to the bylaws shall become effective until approved by the Grand Chapter. These Articles of Incorporation may be amended at any regular meeting of the Board of Trustees, provided said amendment has been theretofore adopted and approved by the Grand Chapter of the Order of the Eastern Star of Iowa.

ARTICLE VIII. The duration of this corporation shall be perpetual.

## ARTICLE IX. DISSOLUTION (Adopted 1986)

In the event of dissolution of this Corporation, then if after payments, satisfaction and discharge of all liabilities and obligations, there are any remaining assets and property, such remaining assets and property of every kind and nature not held upon a condition requiring return, transfer or conveyance by reason of dissolution shall be paid over and transferred to such a charitable Corporation having an office in the State of Iowa as may be determined by two-thirds vote of the eligible voting delegates of an annual meeting or a special called meeting of the Grand Chapter of Iowa Order of the Eastern Star at the time of dissolution and which exempt from taxation under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 (or the corresponding Law). The intention of the Article being to provide that in no event shall any of the assets, earning, or income of the Corporation inure to the benefits of a private individual or Corporation, the purpose of this Corporation being entirely charitable in character.

Said plan of distribution of remaining assets upon dissolution shall be made in compliance with Section 504A.49 Code of lowa, provided, however, that such transfer, conveyance, disposal, or distribution shall be only to such organization or organizations organized and operated exclusively for such purposes and shall at the time qualify as an exempt organization or organizations under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 (or the corresponding provisions of any future United States Internal Revenue Law) as the said plan of distribution shall determine. Any such assets not so disposed of by the District Court of Boone County, Iowa, or of the county in which the principal office of the Corporation is then located, to such organization or organizations said Court shall determine and operated exclusively for such purposed stated above.

Come now John Barrett and Mrs. Twila Seley, who being duly sworn, depose and say that they are the President and Secretary respectively of the Board of Trustees of the Eastern Star Masonic Home and that at a regular meeting of the said Board of Trustees held at Boone, Iowa, on the 25th day of February, 2004.

the above and foregoing Resolutions together with Renewal Amended and Substituted Articles of Incorporation hereto attached were duly presented and adopted by said Board of Trustees at which meeting a quorum of the membership was present at such meeting, and that the amendments set forth above, and each of them received at least two-thirds of the votes entitled to be cast. The said Renewal Amended and Substituted Articles of Incorporation were duly adopted by the Grand Chapter of the Eastern Star of Iowa at its

## ARTICLE I: MEETINGS

Section 1. The annual meeting of the Board of Trustees of the Eastern Star Masonic Home (hereafter referred to as the Board) shall be held each year at the Iowa Annual Grand Chapter Session, order of the Eastern Star. The board shall organize for the ensuing year by electing a President, Vice-President and Secretary-Treasurer.

Section 2. All meetings, except the annual meeting, shall be held at the Eastern Star Masonic Home in Boone, unless a different place is designated by the Board.

Section 3. The presence of three (3) members of the Board shall be required at any meeting for the transaction of business. No Board members shall vote by proxy.

Section 4. At least five (5) days notice of all meetings shall be given each member of the Board by mail, except for emergency special meetings for which notice may be given by telephone or e-mail.

Section 5. The President is responsible for calling regular meetings.

Section 6. Special meetings may be called at any time by the President, or upon request of any two members of the Board.

Section 7. At least (8) meetings of the Board shall be held during the year.

Section 8. At each meeting of the Board, the following shall be the order of business:

- 1, Reading and Approval of the minutes
- 2. Reading of Treasurer's Report
- 3. Approval of Applicants
- 4. Unfinished Business

## ARTICLE II: OFFICERS

Section 1. The President shall preside at all meetings of the Board, appoint all committees and shall have a general supervision of the affairs of the Corporation.

Section 2. The Vice-President shall perform the duties of the President in the absence or inability of this officer to act.

Section 3. The Secretary-Treasurer shall perform such duties as usually pertain to the office and other duties as may be required by the By-laws of the Corporation or as the Board may from time-to-time order. The Secretary-Treasurer shall receive all money from the Grand Chapter designated for the Eastern Star Masonic Home, turning same over to the Administrator.

Section 4. The Board shall be responsible to the Grand Chapter of Iowa, Order of the Eastern Star and shall make an annual report at each Grand Chapter session.

## ARTICLE II: MEMBERSHIP

Section 1. The Board shall consist of five (5) members of the Order of the Eastern Star. These five (5) members of the Board shall be composed of three (3) Sisters and two (2)

Brothers (Section 214 of the Code). Each shall be elected by the Grand Chapter for a term of five (5) years so that one membership shall expire each year. A member who has served two consecutive full terms on the Board shall not be eligible for re-election until the lapse of one Grand Chapter year.

Section 2. The Worthy Grand Matron and Worthy Grand Patron shall be additional members of the Board. They shall have the right to vote on all questions and shall be counted as members of the Board for all purposes, except the counting for a quorum.

Section 3. Each member of the Board shall be reimbursed for mileage to Board meetings computed at a reasonable rate as established by the Board.

#### ARTICLE IV: HOME ADMINISTRATOR

Section 1. The Board shall select and employ a qualified Administrator who shall be its executive in the management of the Eastern Star Masonic Home.

Section 2. At each meeting of the Board, the Administrator shall submit to the Board written statements of income and disbursements for the preceding month and other financial and managerial matters which the Board may require.

Section 3. The Board shall act upon Applicants for the Home as submitted by the Administrator with a majority vote required for acceptance.

## ARTICLE V: MISCELLANEOUS

Section 1. The official records and corporate seal are located, in the safe, at the Eastern Star Masonic Home, 715 West 3<sup>rd</sup> Street, Boone, IA 50036.

Section 2. The Board shall have full charge of the grounds and buildings belonging to the Corporation.

Section 3. No part of the net earnings of this Corporation shall benefit any Board member. No contracts or loans shall be made by the Corporation to its Board members.

Section 4. The Home shall be open to inspection by members of the Grand Chapter of Iowa, Order of the Eastern Star.

The foregoing By-laws or Articles one through five were approved and adopted as the Bylaws of the Eastern Star Masonic Home by the Board of Trustees thereof on this 26<sup>th</sup> day of June 2014.

The number of directors shall be seven (7) which includes five elected by ballot at a Grand Chapter meeting and the Worthy Grand Matron and Worthy Grand Patron during their respective year of office. The Worthy Grand Matron and Worthy Grand Patron shall have the right to vote on all questions and shall be counted as members of the Board for all purposes, except counting for a quorum. All members of the Board will be notified in advance of the meeting and no member shall vote by proxy.

members from the Board of Directors of the Barthell OES Home, the Worthy Grand Matron and the Worthy Grand Patron. Said Board shall have supervision over the relief fund. All cases for relief shall be referred to said Board and after investigation the Board may, by majority vote, extend relief wholly or in conjunction with the Chapter reporting, the city, county, state or federal government, as such relief is deemed expedient. Said Board of Relief shall make rules and regulations necessary for the administration of the relief and all expenses connected with its work shall be paid from the Relief Fund. Relief shall be paid from the Relief Fund. Relief shall be limited to members of Chapters within this Jurisdiction, or dependent children of such members who are of good moral character and recommended for assistance by the Relief Committee of their respective Chapters. The Secretary of the Board of Relief shall annually make a report to the Grand Chapter of all receipts and disbursements, the numbers aided, and other information which may be requested by the Worthy Grand Matron or Worthy Grand Patron. The names of persons to whom relief is granted shall not be required to be given as part of the report.

**RATIONALE:** The wording: <u>Relief shall be paid from the Relief Fund</u>. Is repeated from the previous sentence, so, it should be deleted.

The EDUCATIONAL BOARD AND ESTARL are listed with their own sections so these titles should be eliminated from the title of this area of the code as it relates only to the BOARD OF RELIEF.

Note: The number (8) of members needs to be changed. The Grand Trustees suggest changing this number to "5" to include two members of the Board of Grand Trustees, the Worthy Grand Matron, the Worthy Grand Patron and the Grand Treasurer. The Grand Treasurer to be added as she/he is an elected officer and it creates an odd number for close votes.

It should be the President of the Board of Relief who is making the report at Grand Chapter.

We are deleting the areas of the Code related to the Eastern Star Masonic Home at Boone, and the Barthell Home at Decorah, as we have no ownership of these homes. So, areas of the code addressing these Homes should be deleted.

Relief shall be limited to members of Chapters within this Jurisdiction, or dependent children of such members who are of good moral character and recommended for assistance by the Relief Committee of their respective Chapters. All contributions from projects relative to the Eastern Star Masonic Home at Boone and to the Barthell OES Home at Decorah shall be forwarded to those Homes.

**RATIONALE:** To replace <u>"as the Grand Chapter may direct at that session"</u> with the wording "to each special project as designated at the time it is collected". The Grand Chapter does not direct the money as it is already designated for the project for which it was collected.

**RATIONALE:** Costs have risen while membership has been declining over the years. We are losing approximately twenty-five thousand dollars a year from our accounts. We have had fundraisers and donations, but both have failed to bring in enough money to offset these losses. We have a total membership of under four thousand, and only twenty-three hundred of them are dues paying members. If every one of those members of lowa Eastern Star paid the extra twenty dollars that would increase our income by forty-six thousand dollars. We would then be back to operating on our income instead of raiding our accounts every year.

Worthy Grand Matron, Worthy Grand Patron, Sisters and Brothers. My name is Bill Howie, it has been my honor to serve as the President of the Eastern Star Education Board for 2023. It is my sincere pleasure to introduce the other members of the Education Board. Brother Michael Miller, Vice President; and Sisters Julietta Griffioen, Secretary; and Mary Knupp, member.

We also had the generous aid of Brother Kent Strawn, Grand Treasurer, who also serves as Treasurer to this Board. We also thank Sister Nancy Ramthun, Grand Secretary, whose work behind the scenes keeping track of the ESTARL donations and disbursements and the Education Board loan receipts and disbursements has been invaluable.

Grand Treasurer Kent Strawn's diligence in making certain the Education Loans are up to date as far as balance, interest charges and repayments dates are concerned. As of this date, September 15, 2023, we currently have \$22336.86 in outstanding loans. \$19500.00 of these are loans to students still attending school and are not in repayment at this time. \$4,336.86 is currently in repayment status.

Since the last report four educational loans of \$1,500.00 each were made for a total of \$6,000.00.

ALL members of Eastern Star, not just members of the Education Board and the ESTARL Committee, are encouraged to continue to promote the use of these funds whenever possible.

Our 2023 annual meeting was held on Saturday, July 15, 2023, in person at Home Lodge in Pleasant Hill, IA. In addition to the members of the Board, those in attendance were. Sisters Vicki Wallner, Mary Reicks, Sandy Meredith, and Janice Alger Brothers Larry Niday, and Joe Reed.

The membership of the Order of the Eastern Star places great trust in the Education Board every year to properly administer these funds. Your generous and continuous support through the purchase of nuts at the Grand Officer receptions, donations of the coin March at official visits during March, April, and May, sale of the flag pins and note cards, individual donations, memorials, Chapter memorials and Chapter donations. All donations are tracked through the office of the Grand Secretary. In 2023, these donations amounted to \$10939.28 available for awards. In addition, the Geraldine Wickart Award of \$4000.00 was awarded to Samuel Felderman and the Cliff and Beverly Godsey Award of \$1000.00 was awarded to Jackson Reynolds. Through all of the nut sales, the Grand Officers raised another \$4578.00 which was split equally between all 9 of the applicants.

Through the generosity of Geraldine Wickard (\$4,000) and Cliff and Beverly Godsey (\$1,000) these awards are possible until those funds are depleted.

2023 applicants: 9 applicants (6 previous and three new applicants). Total awards, including the Wickart and Godsey and Grand Officers nut sales was \$20,514.26.

In 2023 the Education Board, Worthy Grand Matron, Worthy Grand Patron, Line Officers and Associate Grand Patron awarded the Grand Chapter funds on a point system that has been in place for several years.

Thank you to everyone who has helped make these funds available for ESTARL. A complete list of names and the award amounts will be printed in the Official Proceeding of the Grand Chapter.

Our continued thanks go to the Grand Trustees and Grand Treasurer for their part in overseeing the investments for the Wickart and Godsey Funds so that these awards may continue for the next few years.

To the Worthy Grand Matron, thank you for asking each of us to serve on this Board. For those who have never served on this Board, it is a real eye-opening experience to be able to read and experience each of these applications and understand just what these funds mean to each one in their educational journey. They are our future as leaders in the Ministry of God.

The speaker for the ESTARL service this year is Chitoka Webb, a previous ESTARL recipient. She will also be speaking at the ESTARL brunch following the service.

As two members leave the Board this year, we welcome two new members and hope that their experience on the Board will be just as rewarding for them.

#### REPORT OF THE PUBLIC SCHOOLS COMMITTEE

Thank you, Vicki and Larry, for asking me to be on this committee. Twenty chapters submitted reports this year. Two chapters did not do anything with their public schools. The others are listed in alphabetical order by chapter name.

 Albia Chapter donated funds to their local elementary school and have a member who helps in her child's classroom.

- Amber Star Chapter at Carson has members who take tickets at the theater and sporting events at the school, sell items at the concession stand during ball games and 2 members listen to children read once a week for a period of 3 months.
- Aspasia Chapter at Sigourney donated school supplies at the beginning of the school year and plan to donate clothing, personal care supplies, cleaning wipes and possible lice kits in the winter/spring.
- E. C. Blackmore Chapter at Burlington donated items for school backpacks and also donates mittens, hats, and gloves to the school.
- Cedar Falls Chapter has a member who is a Reading Buddy participant at one of the grade schools.
- Central Chapter at Marshalltown had four members donate school supplies on their own.
- Clarinda Chapter donated school supplies in the Backpack program. Two of their members teach school even though they are "retired."
- Davenport Chapter has a member who assists in a reading program.
- Exodus Chapter at Exira awarded four scholarships to high school graduates.
- Golden Rule Chapter at Atlantic donates \$180.00 to the elementary school to use for their lunch or milk programs.
- Indianola Chapter donates funds for food at Lunch in the Park for children during the summer.
- Laurens Chapter donates school supplies, hats, gloves, and mittens to their school. One of their members is the Booster Club president.
- Malta Chapter at Cedar Rapids added \$50.00 to their September coin march and sent it to Kathy Pantzar to help her group with postage for the boxes to be sent to the military personnel.
- Oelwein Chapter's members donated supplies to a local backpack program and has a member who reads with students.
- Polk City Chapter members voted on bond issues and school board elections.
  They also have several members who volunteer at their grandchildren's school.
  They purchase items during fundraisers at the school and one member has been the official score keeper for home varsity basketball games for over 30 years.
- Southgate Chapter at Des Moines awarded a \$500.00 scholarship to a student.
- Twilight Chapter at Spirit Lake donated school supplies and have two members do volunteer work at the local school.
- Unity Chapter at Mason City matched a \$250.00 donation from one of their members to the Salvation Army's school backpack program.

## **GENERAL GRAND CHAPTER SERVICE DOGS**

A service dog is an invaluable asset to a disabled Veteran. These dogs, besides giving companionship and loyal service, help the Veteran in many ways. PTSD can be debilitating and can keep the Veteran from functioning in society. Service dogs react to the slightest hint of anxiety and intervene by bringing the Veteran back to reality. Always with them, the dog helps them to gain confidence and independence.

Traumatic Brain Injuries can cause balance issues and the service dog is always there to support the Veteran. The Veteran can use the dog for balance or breaking a fall. The dogs are used as support while going up or down stairs. Items dropped are retrieved by the dog. Getting up from a chair can be difficult but with the help of a dog they can get up and the dog will help by bracing for support or by using the harness hold, the dog helps with forward momentum.

The Order of the Eastern Star Supports **Service Dogs!** I have attended several schools and one of the degrees by the Grand Officers and have had to replenish my pins a couple of times. If I attend a meeting, I will have my pins with me and I have several brochures from "Partners for Patriots." As I have said before, "All funds raised in Iowa will stay in Iowa." Come see me.

WORTHY GRAND MATRON, Sisters and Brothers, Our MWGM and MWGP endorsed the partnership between GGC and Wake Forest Institute for Regenerative Medicine as one of their selected charities and a special project for the MWGP for this triennium.

As a member of the General Grand Chapter Regenerative Medicine Committee, it has been my pleasure to meet other members on Zoom meetings.

The goal this triennium is one million dollars and many activities are being planned to meet this goal. One fun activity is cruises so if you are interested, let me know.

At these zoom meetings, we have heard from many researchers from Wake Forest about their research projects. Their mantra is "Next is Now," always dedicated to finding a cure, not just a treatment. With over 300 employees from over 64 countries, their passion for helping human beings throughout the world is never ending.

As I mentioned last year, one project, using a 3-D printer and "bioink", the team created tiny replicas of human organs - some as small as a pinhead - to test drugs. This process is also used for testing treatments for cancer and other diseases as well as analyzing a drug's impact on an organ.

Tissue loss and organ dysfunction are commonplace in modern medical care. Over the past half century, the transfer of tissue and organ transplantation has revolutionized our ability to care for these disease entities. This spans the spectrum from breast reconstruction following a mastectomy to solid organ transplants. Despite the advances they are not without many problems and all require a suitable donor.

Tissue engineering represents a field aimed at creating biological replacements that can mimic native tissue. Two weeks ago, a research paper was published presenting a significant breakthrough in the area of skin regeneration and wound healing by researchers at Wake Forest. It showed the successful development of bioprinted skin that

accelerates wound healing and provides optimism for complete wound recovery.

The creation of complete full thickness skin has not been possible to date. Normal skin has three layers and this bioprinted skin not only formed all layers but it formed blood vessels and normal tissue formation. They also found improved wound closure, reduced skin contraction and reduced scarring.

It is exciting to hear about these innovations but these studies take money, and that is the goal of this committee. You can begin by buying a pin so see me if you haven't purchased one yet.

Worthy Grand Matron, Sisters, Brothers and Friends. I hope that you have visited my table out in the foyer. As most of you know, I have been selling the pins from General Grand Chapter which include the "Paw" pin, "Bone" pin, logo pin, music pin and I have added the miniature "paw" pins. There are t-shirts from "Partners for Patriots" for sale as well as literature about service dogs and "Partners for Patriots." As a reminder, the money raised, stays in Iowa to assist with the training of dogs.

Our service dog project is "Partners for Patriots." They are a 501(c)(3) organization and was founded in 2009 to provide Service Dogs to disabled Veterans. They are located in rural Anthon, Iowa. Cindy Brodie is the director and lead trainer of the group. Over the years that she has been doing this, she has placed dogs in several states outside of Iowa as well as in Iowa. Some of these dogs assist with balance for the Veteran, picking up items from the floor that have been dropped, retrieving items from the refrigerator, and helping with PTSD. Gerry Holtrop, a retired deputy sheriff of Sioux County, is the person who takes the dog to their special person and then stays and trains the two of them together as the final step in placement of a service dog.

Puppies are sometimes donated to the organization. These puppies are then placed with a "puppy raiser" for about a year to learn basic commands, be house trained, and to be acclimated to being around people.

In December 2022, I was able to present a check for \$4183.20 that was raised from the sale of pins and donations in that year and the money held over from the previous triennium. An article along with a picture of me handing the check last December, to Gerry Holtrop was in the Galaxy. So far this year, we have raised \$1999.56, for Partners for Patriots. The money that was raised from selling the t-shirts since I started is \$1648. This was given to "Partners for Patriots" as the money was raised.

This year I have started to volunteer with "Partners for Patriots." My first outing was at the Plymouth County Fair in LeMars. At the Plymouth County Fair, we did not sell anything while I was there as it was a hot day, but many stopped at the booth to see the two service dogs in training that Cindy and Maddison, a trainer in training, had at that fair and literature was handed out.

I also assisted at the Clay County Fair, in Spencer, for 2 days. Again, Cindy Brodie and Maddison were there with their dogs in training for the first day. On the second day, they were there but we also had a veteran with his dog "Radar" in attendance. "Radar" had been delivered about a month before and helps this young man with PTSD. Before receiving "Radar" he was unable to go out in public and speak to people. Now, with "Radar" he is able to go out and visit with people. He was there at the fair visiting with people who stopped at the booth and was telling them of his trials before "Radar" came to him.

Now, I have a red quilt with dogs, cats, elephants, and penguins. It has been at my table for silent auction. The winner is: Becky Woolery, Evening Shade Chapter, Spencer for \$100.00. Thank you, Becky, one of my OES kids. This money will go to Partners for Patriots.

In closing I wish to say that this is a wonderful project and does set the Order of the Eastern Star to be recognized as an organization with fidelity, constancy, loyalty, faith and love. I want to thank Sister Glenda Winchester, Most Worthy Grand Matron and Past Grand Matron of South Carolina, and Brother F. Lon Lowry, Most Worthy Grand Patron, and Past Grand Patron of Ohio, for this appointment. Thank you to everyone for your support of this project.




