On May 16th, we will perform the Conferring of Degrees at Newton Chapter. Watch for information on Iowa OES Website.

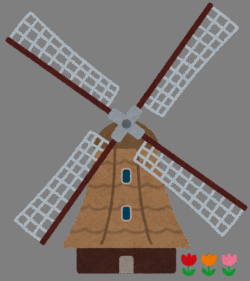

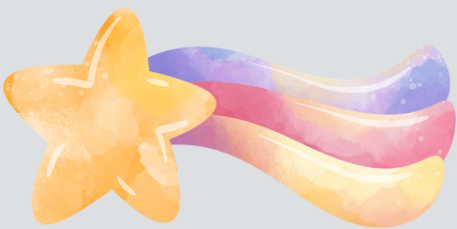
